Two days National Conference on “Targeted Bioconjugates for Drug Delivery to Cancer Cells” 05/10/2018- 06/10/2018

GUJCOST Sponsored “Two days National Conference on Targeted Bioconjugates for Drug Delivery to Cancer Cells” was organized at Maliba Pharmacy College, Bardoli on, 05-06 October 2018. Dean of Pharmacy College Dr. Ashish Mishra welcomed the participants and delegates and also gave information about Maliba Pharmacy College and University. The Conference was presided over by Mr. Kirit Patel, Secretary BPKM and Dr. Kirti V. Patel as a Chief Guest. In her Guest address Dr. Kirti Patel highlighted the importance of development of targeted therapies for cancer. The fourth technical session was delivered by Dr Kamalesh Prasad Principal Scientist, CSMCRI, Bhavnagar. He had highlighted the marine resources research along with isotonic solvents for sustainable research in pharmaceutical application.

On the second day 06/10/18 the fifth technical session was delivered by Dr Amit Mishra Scientist F CSIR CDRI-Lucknow. He had discussed the various research perspectives of tuberculosis treatment. He motivates the students to do significant in health systems/drug delivery, specially for diseases of socio-economically challenged people like Leishmaniasis.

The sixth technical session was delivered by Dr Gunjan Verma Scientist BARC, Mumbai. Dr Verma had discussed characterization of nanomaterial by scattering techniques. Madam had discussed interpretation and various problems of different scattering technique, which could be a cause of misleading results. The session was very interactive with students and faculty members. The speakers/ resource persons were honored with a memento and certificate from hands of different faculty members.

Poster session was arranged on 06/10/18 at architecture building Deewan-E-Aam.
